PE AND SPORT PREMIUM

The PE and Sport Premium is funding from the government for the academic 2017/18 to provide additional substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is going directly to primary school head teachers to spend money on improving or enhancing the quality of Physical Education and sport for all children. At present we have a high quality level of PE and sport in the school, having achieved a Gold sports mark standard for PE, but this funding will help develop even more opportunities for children to take part in more sport.

KEY FACTS

Pinchbeck East Primary School will spend the funding in various ways. We will provide high quality coaching from sports companies to deliver more after school clubs. There will be more variety of clubs on offer made possible by an increase in people delivering the activities. At Pinchbeck East we have always entered numerous sports competitions and festivals and this will continue and the funding will pay for this and the transport to get to the venues. Funds will also be used to contribute to a Multi Use Games Area in order to enable accessibility to a variety of sports all year round, including inter and intra sports competitions.

Numerous festivals, competitions and fixtures have been attended by the school giving opportunities across KS2 for more pupil involvement.

Elite provide/have provided many opportunities for after school sports clubs throughout the year.

Change for life clubs and gifted and talented clubs have also been delivered at lunchtimes enabling participation for all children across both Key Stages. This will be on going on a rolling programme.

There has been more inter house competitions and playground leaders to support younger children in KS1 playground.
